The XIIth workshop is shaping up to be our best IWLH ever, and we look forward to welcoming you to Lisbon on the 16th-18th January, 2025.

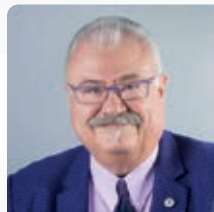
